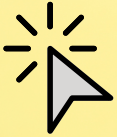

About the CO Safety Grant

The Zachary and Nicholas Burt Carbon Monoxide Poisoning Prevention Act is named after four-year-old Zachary and 16 month-old Nicholas Burt, who died of carbon monoxide poisoning. Preference will be given to applicants who have developed a strategy to protect vulnerable populations, such as children, the elderly, or low-income households, from exposure to unhealthy levels of CO.

Use of Grant Funds

The award range is **\$50,000-\$400,000**.

Funds may be used to:

- Purchase and install compliant carbon monoxide alarms in the dwelling units of low-income families or elderly individuals, and facilities that commonly serve children or the elderly;
- Develop and disseminate training materials, instructors, and any other costs relating to the training sessions authorized under this subsection; or
- Educate the public about:
 - risks associated with carbon monoxide as a poison
 - importance of proper carbon monoxide alarm use
